Her blonde curls bounce as she skips ahead of me down Main St. And it seems like with every bounce comes either a new question or a lyric to a song which I really do not want to get into my head. As Barb and I head to Myer the question that get asked relates to how far away Christmas is. I do my best to keep it liturgical, and reminder her that we are still in the season of Pentecost and that there is the four Sundays of Advent still to come. But then I do the math. And there is suddenly less than 50 days left until Christmas and only a week and change left until Advent.

Advent for us is supposed to be a season of preparation and getting ready. We are supposed to get ready for the coming of Christmas. As well as being reminded to make ourselves ready and prepare ourselves for the day when Christ returns. Often we see two responses to preparation. The first is on the day after Thanksgiving we grab everything out of storage and throw it all up as quickly as we can. The other is that we wait until the last minute, either due to procrastination or a very full calendar. In our house usually the decorations follow the first approach and the wrapping of presents follow the second.

But is that how we are supposed to move through Advent? I remember with amazing clarity the one Friday in Advent when in Seminary Chapel we walked in to see Mulder Chapel decorated. This surprisingly was an odd moment. The chapel was often forgotten because of how the class schedule fell and how busy staff and students all were during the season. Some even would joke that a particular retired seminary professor would not just have had a duck but a whole flock of them if suddenly there were flashing lights and more decorations than three wreathes. But lo and behold there were flashing lights as well as a

whole host of other decorations in the chapel that day.

The gist of the message that day was the visual removal of all the decorations, except for the three wreathes, and the statement that God desires preparation of ourselves more than preparations of our homes for Advent. There was a disconcerted feeling in the room when suddenly the class that was leading worship all stood up, grabbed a piece of décor and walked out of the chapel. There were several audible gasps when it happened. Personally I was torn between actively stopping it and also knowing that something more than what I saw was happening was going on.

Now things like this can happen in the safe laboratory space of a seminary where you can test out and engage with worship in a way that would not work in your average congregation. But just because you wont see anyone putting up or taking down a string of lights in the sanctuary doesn't mean that the question asked of us back then is any less pertinent now.

What does the Lord want more from us this Advent? Is it to have the best décor and an exterior light display which would make Clark Griswold jealous. Or is it to not just prepare our homes and trees for the coming of Christmas, but to use the time of Advent to make ourselves ready for the day when Christ comes in all his glory. May your Advent be filled with productive preparation not just in putting up your decorations, but in preparing yourself. Amen.




