By the time that you read this Lent will likely have begun. It's a wonderful time but it's one that is fraught with trouble. In the calendar of the church year it is an opportunity to prepare or make ready, to gain closeness with God. It starts with what we are to do or not do with it. Traditionally we add or give things up attempting either to add a disciple or take away something.

But it gets more complex than simply adding or taking away. The purpose of Lent as I said before is to grow closer to God that is <u>the</u> goal. Fasting from things is just one ways to mark this, as is adding something to our spiritual practices. There are a whole host of things that we can do, however these seems to be the most normative. There are even a plethora of ways in which you can fast. You can fast from foods, from technology, or from stuff. But just as you can fast you can pray, or spend time with scripture. There is no limit to options which are available to us on this journey, as long as we are heading toward that goal.

But with this comes several difficulties. There is a question of engagement, and challenge of practice. We give up or fast from things that don't matter or don't separate us from God or we don't eat or drink in the first place. We allow ourselves little moments to break our fast which are big enough or wide enough so that we never really have given anything up in the first place. Or when we fail or time and schedule challenge us too much we chuck it all in and give up.

But even when we do manage to pick out or select something that will be productive, we then defeat the purpose of it by making it a source of pride. We strut around like Pat Ma-

homes because we haven't had sugar for all of Lent, or we've given up McDonalds. We let everyone who will listen and some who don't want to hear how great we've been for all this Lenten journey. But how does this all bring us closer to God?

The challenge for all of us is to take a moment and ask ourselves how we can grow closer to God. The next step in this process is to wonder or consider how we can best make that happen. Is it through fasting, through prayer, through care for creation, care for the gift of our bodies? How can we get closer to God? Then instead of telling the world about it share your choice of paths with someone who can and will help you to be accountable. This isn't so that we can brag but so that we have an ally who can hold our feet to the fire but also check in with our failures and successes.

At his introductory press conference Ben Johnson told his team, and I also suspect the fans as well to be comfortable being uncomfortable. Accept that growing closer to God means doing things that challenge us and make us uncomfortable. Growing closer to God means embracing a feeling that you're not on solid ground and are doing something new. Remember how when you were younger and you were growing? Your shoes sometimes

didn't fit, your clothes shifted in size, and not because you put them in the dryer. Being uncomfortable and being challenged is how we grow. May we all grow a little bit more as we progress towards Easter. Amen.




